AGREE

Agree WITH a person, opinion or policy:

I entirely agree with you. He left the firm because he didn't agree with their sales policy.

Agree ABOUT a subject of discussion:

We agree about most things.

Agree ON a matter for decision:

Let's **agree on** a date.

Agree TO a suggestion:

I'll agree to your suggestion if you lower the price.

TO BE AGREED

If people are agreed, they have discussed something and agreed about what to do:

All parties are now agreed on the plan.
We're all agreed that we cannot spend what we have not earned.
"Let's just forget it ever happened. Agreed?" "Agreed."
