AGREE

Agree WITH a person, opinion or policy:

I entirely agree with you.

*He left the firm because he didn't **agree with** their sales policy.*

Agree ABOUT a subject of discussion:

*We **agree about** most things.*

Agree ON a matter for decision:

*Let's **agree on** a date.*

Agree TO a suggestion:

*I'll **agree to** your suggestion if you lower the price.*

TO BE AGREED

If people are agreed, they have discussed something and agreed about what to do:

All parties are now agreed on the plan.

We're all agreed that we cannot spend what we have not earned.

“Let's just forget it ever happened. Agreed?” “Agreed.”
