

***TO HAVE* + object + Past Participle**

Causative *have*

- ***TO HAVE*** + object + past participle can mean “cause something to be done by someone else.”

I had my hair cut yesterday. [= someone did it for me.]

I must have the house cleaned.

I'm going to have my mobile repaired.

- When *to have* is used in this way, the negative and interrogative forms of its present and past tenses are formed with ***TO DO***.

“*Do you have your house cleaned every week?*”

“*I don't have it cleaned, I clean it myself.*”

- ***TO GET*** can be used in the same way, though it tends to be more colloquial.

I'd like to get my house painted next year.
