EXPECT HOPE LOOK FORWARD TO + NP/ <-ing> WAIT

- If you **EXPECT** something, you think that it will happen:

We're expecting a visit from Bill this summer.

- If you **HOPE** for something, you want it to happen and you think there is a possibility that it might happen:

We're all hoping for fine weather.

- If you **LOOK FORWARD TO** something, you think that it will happen and feel happy as a result:

I'm really looking forward to the holidays.

- **WAIT (FOR)** is an action, not a state of mind: to stay without doing anything until someone or something comes or something happens:

We waited and waited but no one came.
