## SUCH, SUCH A, SO

1. SO is used with an adjective when no noun follows, or with an adv
--

I am so tired. He speaks so quickly.

2. **SUCH A** is used with a singular countable noun, with or without an adjective:

He is such a liar. It is such a long way.

3. **SUCH** is used with uncountable nouns and also plural nouns:

I have never before experienced such cold weather. He told such stupid lies.

- 4. **SO** is used with nouns when these are preceded by *much*, *little*, *many* or *few*: *so little time*, *so many people*.
- 5. The construction **so** (**adjective**) **a** (**noun**) is also used but less commonly:

It was so long a story that we nearly fell asleep.
